

## A Year 3 musician will:

In Key Stage 2	<ul> <li>Play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using voice and playing instruments with increasing accuracy, control and expression</li> <li>Improvise and compose music using inter-related dimensions of music separately and in combination</li> <li>Listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory</li> <li>Use and understand the basics of the stave and other musical notations</li> <li>Appreciate and understand a wide range of high-quality live and recorded music from different traditions and from great musicians and composers</li> <li>Develop and understanding of the history of music</li> </ul>
Perform This concept involves understanding that music is created to be performed	<ul> <li>Sing in Tune</li> <li>Pronounce words within a song clearly</li> <li>Play notes on an instrument so that they are clear</li> </ul>
Compose This concept involves appreciating that music is created through a process which has a number of techniques	<ul> <li>Create repeated patterns with a range of instruments</li> <li>Create accompaniments for tunes</li> <li>Choose, order, combine and control sounds to create an effect</li> </ul>
Transcribe This concept involves understanding that compositions need to be understood by others and that there are techniques and a language for communicating them	<ul> <li>Devise non-standard symbols to indicate when to play and rest</li> <li>Recognise the symbol for a crotchet and say how many beats it represents</li> <li>Recognise the notes FACE on the musical stave</li> </ul>
Appraise/Describe Music This concept involves appreciating the features of musical elements	<ul> <li>Evaluate music using musical vocabulary to identify areas of likes and dislikes</li> <li>Use term tempo and use of silence to describe music</li> </ul>
